Working Wales

Working Wales, delivered by Careers Wales, provides free advice and guidance to get people into jobs and up-skill through courses and training

They provide tools such as <u>Support Finder</u> and vacancy bulletins tailored to an individual's career preferences (including childcare). They also signpost to sector job vacancies

ReAct+ - a new adult employability programme will launch in the spring 2022 to support unemployed adults aged 18 and over to obtain sustainable employment. The programme will provide individualised support to those trying to enter the labour market by providing grant support such as vocational training, childcare and travel costs.

ReAct+ will offer employers who take on new employees a 12 month wage subsidy grant of up to £3,000. An additional £1,000 is available to those employers who recruit an individual who is between 18 and 24 or who are disabled and reimbursement of 50% of the cost of any job-related training needed by the new recruit (up to a maximum of £1,000) will also be offered.

The new programme can also support work experience placements where this is an identified barrier to employment
